Let God define love

I recently read a letter dripping with sarcasm that mocked various brothers and sisters because according to the writer, their love was a mean love, a hateful love. This angry soul complained that many speak about love but do not practice love. So, the question that needs addressed very often in churches and in the world is what is love? I won't go through the four Greek words here, but will focus on that agape love spoken of in Scripture so often. What is love? We are told to love one another and thus fulfill the law, 1 Corinthians 13 is called the chapter of love as Paul gives us the qualities of love. Then Romans 12 has much to say about love. That agape love is mentioned 110 times in the New Testament. Yet, our personal definitions of love seem to take precedence over God's word. For most, love never rebukes, never corrects, never punished and never rejects. That should seem errant at first glance for good reasons. For we know that God is love (1 John 4:7). Has God never rebuked, corrected or never punished, never rejected? Of course God often disciplines those he loves and protects them from evil. Years ago a popular Christian author spoke of tough love, making hard choices for the hope of your children and those you love. Tough love doesn't always make everyone happy. In fact, rarely does tough love make most people happy. A child must obey his parents or suffer the consequences of punishment in order not to suffer greater consequences in the world. In faith and in God's family, tough love is unpleasant and often not practiced because no one want to be the "bad guy," no one wants to be judged for their judgment.

Later, another popular Christian author challenged the idea of tough love. Not by saying that we never rebuke or correct but he claims that there is no such thing as tough love, only love. He points out that godly love is not governed by our feelings and emotions but by truth and righteous choices. Reading God's word and 1 Corinthians 13, love is not determined by the feelings of others but the motivation of whatever action is taken. Love does not rejoice in unrighteousness but rejoices with the truth. Hebrew 12 tells us that those without discipline are illegitimate children.

Love also protects. The shepherd loves the sheep and protects them. So how does he respond to wolves? Rom. 12:9 declares: "Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is evil; cling to what is good." We live in a world that defends so many wicked, godless actions by declaring them to be acts of love. So much immorality, greed, selfishness is proclaimed to actually be the loving choice because it is what makes some happy. Let us be clear, love and righteousness defined by God are all that matters.

In Matthew 18 and 1 Corinthians 5, we are instructed, commanded about how to deal with rebellious believers. Separating the flock from the wolves is not an act of hate but of love. But even then, God's guidance of separation from an unruly brother or sister is not with the end goal of punishment but the punishment has the end goal or hope of redemption through honest repentance. We see this in action in 2 Corinthians as the offensive sinner changes, repents and is restored to the family of faith.

Do not be intimidated or made to feel guilty by the rebellious or lawless voices either in the church or the world. Do remove the log from your eye if needed but then understand the obligation to see clearly and remove those specks that also blind souls. Let God define love and not this world of darkness. God's love first and foremost will protect the flock from those deceitful voices, no matter how loudly they protest. And God's love will rebuke when needed. Even Jesus had to correct the Apostle Peter with some of the most painful words imaginable: "Get behind Me. Satan: for you are not setting your mind on God's interests, but man's."

"Get behind Me, Satan; for you are not setting your mind on God's interests, but man's."

Mark 8:33. Jesus did so out of love and righteousness. Jesus who is meek and mild also cleared the temple of the wicked and hateful souls.

"By this the children of God and the children of the devil are obvious: anyone who does not practice righteousness is not of God, nor the one who does not love his brother." 1 John 3:10.
