No Navel Gazers Allowed

Surely you have heard of the legend of Narcissus. The boy loved himself so much that he spent all of his time gazing at his own reflection in a pond until he fell in and drowned. Today the greatest threat to my own life is narcissism, placing my own importance above all else. The destruction is seen everywhere. It affects marriages, job performance, even your poor finances. We see this narcissistic effect in conversations even among God's people. How often do we approach others on the basis of what we want or what we believe or think? James tells us: "What is the source of quarrels and conflicts among you? Is not the source your pleasures that wage war in your members? ²You lust and do not have; so you commit murder. You are envious and cannot obtain; so you fight and quarrel. You do not have because you do not ask." James 4:1-2. In other words, complete Narcissist. Or as a friend of mine describes the problem: Navel Gazers, only focused on self. When my ego, my point of view, my feelings are paramount in even a casual conversation, then I don't bless. I am the source of the problem and what should be a blessed moment of fellowship becomes an argument and conflict, even in God's house. Church tradition relates how in his old age, the Apostle John barely had the strength to gather with the brothers. Younger men would help him gather with the saints. And John had one message he repeated again and again: Children, love one another. John wrote three short letters to the brothers. In 1 John he writes: "We love, because He first loved us!" 1 John 4:19. A beautiful sentiment. But I do think we need to dig beneath the surface of these words to truly understand. You see, when John wrote this, it was a reflection of personal experience. For three years he saw the love of Christ to the point that when he wrote his own gospel, he referred to himself as "the disciple whom Jesus loved." That was not narcissism or "navel gazing." That was staring into the love of Christ. So in his old age, he gathers the hearts of the church with these words: "We love, because He first loved us!"

When we gather, we remember the love of Christ. We reflect on the healings of the unworthy, the value given to the failed lives, the compassion for the rebellious, the patience for the ignorant and stubborn. And "We love, because He first loved us." We remember Jesus on those hot days, also on those celebrations, the long nights, and those sufferings. "We love because He first loved us!"

So when we greet one another, we love one another. It is such a small request to be patient, to be kind, to listen more than we speak, to bless rather than to seek one's own. The key is your focus. Don't focus on self. God gave you two eyes both physically and spiritually. With one eye, focus on the love of Christ given to you, and with that other eye, focus on your love for those in your presence. Remember, it was Abel who chose sacrifice of what was in his grasp in order to honor God. It was Cain who was the navel gazer.
