"Are you able to drink the cup that I am about to drink?"

Good old James and John. Crafty boys, maybe more crafty than the others. They got mama (Imma) to ask Jesus for a favor. "Command that in Your kingdom these two sons of mine may sit one on Your right and one on Your left." Mark 20:21. But then Jesus turned to the brothers and asked: "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I am about to drink?" Matt. 20:22.

What exactly was that "cup"? We do know that later James was killed by Herod's sword. John is believed to have died of old age. So, what was that cup? I believe it was the heart of surrender to the love of God. What drove Jesus daily, what kept him on target and what ultimately led him to that cross was the heart surrendered to the love of God. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Begotten Son..."

On this particular day James and John seemed more concerned with position and authority than the love God has for His creation. On this day James and John seemed more preoccupied with themselves than others. In fact, the proof is seen in Jesus' own words: "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great men exercise authority over them. ²⁶"It is not this way among you, but whoever wishes to become great among you shall be your servant, ²⁷ and whoever wishes to be first among you shall be your slave; ²⁸ just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many." Matt. 20:25-28.

I am always amazed at how many seem eager to command, dictate, and control but how few strive to serve and sacrifice. Many are those who want to lead but few who seek to follow. And it isn't just in overt leadership such as managers, bosses, or even elders and preachers. Sometimes it is more subtle than that. Sometimes it is the ballplayer who wants the ball all of the time. Maybe it is the young girl who will gossip to eliminate competition over a boy. Or then there are those who always have great suggestions to accomplish a task but rarely leads in such service.

Over the years to come, the disciples would learn about that "cup." Of the 12 apostles, 11 would die violent deaths. Those deaths were not just in service of God but in love for the people. Paul would once say: "For I could wish that I myself were accursed, separated from Christ for the sake of my brethren, my kinsmen according to the flesh" Rom. 9:3. John would remind us: "for the one who does not love his brother whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen." 1 John 4:20. James tells us to use our tongues to bless, not curse.

We are a group of Christians worshipping God according to the Teaching in the New Testament. May we all worship our loving Father today with sincere hearts, open and receptive to His Spirit and His love.
