Changing the Trajectory

"Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, And in sin my mother conceived me." Psalm 51:5. There is a cultural fallacy expressed so often today where the latest generation blames the previous one for their woes. It's nothing new. In the days of Ezekiel, the people were infamous blamers of their fathers. You heard it in the popular saying on the streets of Jerusalem: "The fathers eat the sour grapes, But the children's teeth are set on edge" Ezek, 18:2. In other words, it's not my fault that I am what I am. My parents made me this way! Yet look at Ezekiel 18. Regardless of what "they" (your parents) did, you and I are responsible for our own choices. It is a beautiful thing to be raised by godly parents but it is equally a rare commodity to be raised by godly parents in this day and age. Each morning I turn on the news to hear that one more person's life has been taken, one more family is going through heart ache. And the news has no capacity to cover all of the heart ache even in our local neighborhoods. There is abuse of so many descriptions. What hope does our society have when it appears that the cards are stacked against us? There is no magic pill, no incantation or carefully worded supplication that will rescue us from our woes. So the cycle continues for one more generation until... Until we choose not to. Perhaps that sounds as simplistic as the magic pill. It is not. It is calling on us to choose a way that few will muster the fortitude to conquer. It is why Jesus calls us "to strive." Luke 13:24. But for those few, there is hope, there is grace, there is a redemption even in this life. The stories of such changing the trajectory are replete in Scripture: Abraham left Haran, left all he knew to start the greatest journey with God imaginable. Ruth abandoned the comfort and security of her own people because in Naomi she saw a greater calling. And David recognized the failures of his own family and bowed before the Great I AM. The passage above from Psalm 51 is David's repentance after great failure. He sees that he was just following in the steps of those before him but no longer. So David sings: "Create in me a clean heart, O God, And renew a steadfast spirit within me." Ps. 51:10. No longer will David excuse his actions, his thoughts, his habits because of those who were before him. No longer will David say that it's not his fault. By the grace of God David will choose change. He will break that mold that has held down so many generations. One of the most vexing realities I have seen over my lifetime is that the poor habits and destructive values of one generation seem to be passed on to the next. Among those are often failure to commit to what matters. So marriages fall apart, children are too much trouble because parents are too busy (self-absorbed). Poverty from a lack of determination seem to go to each new generation. All the while, we come armed with our excuses and reasons. So, how do you get this clean heart, this steadfast spirit? You pick up a new "playbook," The Bible. "The law of the LORD is perfect, restoring the soul; The testimony of the LORD is sure, making wise the simple." Ps. 1917. In other words, it isn't out of your reach or ability. Even the simple become wise with God. But to abandon the comfort of failure is daunting. The question is how badly do you want hope, how much do you want to win at life and will you truly trust God and not repeat that failed trajectory of your past and the past of those failures who have gone before you? It is time to change your trajectory. And who knows? Maybe even your loved ones will see the hope and they too will long for such strength. Make it start with you!

"but as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD." Joshua 24:15. That spirit will save your soul and finally give that future generation the life and example to follow.
