"You shall teach them diligently to your sons"

One of the more frightening realities of society is how quickly things can change. There is an old saying that we are never more than one generation away from apostasy or extinction. We see this repeatedly in the Old Testament. The generation of Joshua is replaced by the faithless years of Judges. A good king like Hezekiah was followed by the evils of Manasseh. In 2 Kings, the people of God have almost forgotten about God. God still has his spokesmen, the prophets, but no one is listening. Then there is this odd story of what appears to be a group of teenager boys or young men who mock God's spokesman, Elisha. "Go up, you baldhead!" 2 Kings 2;23. (With my thinning hair, I understand the insult.) But in this story bears come out and attack these young men. Obviously God's judgment and punishment for their irreverence for God's prophet.

The question is: How did things get so far from God? How did an entire village become so corrupt and rebellious? I look about today's world and see that it happens quicker and easier than we might think possible. These 42 boys in Bethel might well come from 42 sets of parents, 84 fathers and mothers who had not taught God's word to their families. So, what had these parents taught their sons? Perhaps to work hard and get a good education. Maybe they taught theirs sons that life is short, so have fun, enjoy your life. Maybe they wanted their sons to have all of the good things in life they never had. After all, the popular god at this time was not the LORD but Baal, the god of having it all. In our churches today we have to ask ourselves what message have our children learned from us. In the 21 century, the church is getting older. In many congregations, we see more elderly than youth. We want to blame society, blame the school system, blame the shift in economy. Maybe it is time for us to return to the commands of Deuteronomy 6: "You shall teach them diligently to your sons." Deut. 6:7.

The word Moses uses for diligently is \text{ijj} shaman - to sharpen or "whet" a sword. A sharpened sword takes diligence, time, care and even skill. We revere our society and culture more than God when we place the greatest emphasis on having the good life. Some push education, some sports or beauty. We want fun, pleasure, and ease for our children. What about righteousness? Are we sharpening that need and desire for righteousness? The problem in 2 Kings 2 is not those 42 irreverent boys but the 84 unconcerned parents. It is also worth noting that this took place in the area of Bethel - "house of God." At one time a hub for righteousness. But rather than a house of God, they had a golden calf there. They called that golden idol "the God of Israel" when in truth it was the god of self-fulfillment.

I think today's church suffers from parents who have not sharpened that sword of righteousness in their children. You might think about whetting that sword, you probably have plans to do it someday, maybe you even pray over the son or daughter, but are you doing the task? How often? How consistently? And who is the real authority in sharpening the sword of the soul? Does the child make the rules or do you as a parent choose the path? Are there great excuses for not teaching diligently or do you plan your life and your child's life around the glory of God? New parents in Christ have a very difficult task. Everything in this world wants priority in their lives. There are a lot of "Baals" out there calling for the soul. God calls for knowing what is right and doing what is right. God calls for faithful obedience to His kingdom.

Elisha was mocked by young men of that village who for whatever reason, had not learned God's word, not embraced God's word and therefore had no real concern for God's ways. We are always just one generation away from extinction. On the other hand, maybe we are just one generation from greatness. Teach them diligently, sharpen the sword of righteousness.
