Footnotes for the Soul

Religion and Politics! Two topics that can ruin a Holiday. Why? Well, it is more than mere disagreements, but it is the emotional powder Keg that comes with it. And there is the rub! Emotions often cloud judgment or reason. With emotions, we don't need facts. Feelings trump facts every time. You listen to what agrees with your pre-determined emotional state and close your eyes and ears to what might be a good argument against your pre-determined convictions. Like an interview with a journalist who constantly interrupts the respondent when she doesn't like the answers. Or what about those men who stoned Stephen. They covered their ears, shouted and killed the messenger. Today we see this same attitude when it comes to defending our values and virtues.

But what about facts? Recently, I started re-reading a book I had started a few years ago. I soon realized why I put it down and did not finish it. It was about church history. In the first two chapters I found glaring discrepancies in the narrative that do not match the facts. So, I won't be wasting my energies on that book. But here is what I noticed this time that matters: Footnotes! No, not good footnotes but a lack of any footnotes to verify his claims with the recorded history. It was like he was making it up as he went along.

Remember those High School and college papers where the teacher demanded footnotes? Without proper footnotes you are at a loss to know what to believe or trust. No matter how great your essay or report was written, without footnotes you get a failing mark. Today we need to once again apply this same resolve. Verify, verify, verify. Even if it goes against your feelings... *Especially* when it conflicts with your feelings. That means that you verify your opponent's word but especially you verify your favorite sources.

So many discussions on politics are rooted in closed minds who only trust their favorite sources. So many debates in faith come from favorite personalities, doctrinal alliances and not from open Bibles that dig beneath the quote of a passage taken out of context.

Just as those footnotes in school were such a pain, to verify my beliefs and convictions with God's word takes a commitment few believers ever attempt.

Remember what Jesus said to those "Bible experts," the Pharisees: **"You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; it is these that testify about Me; ⁴⁰and you are unwilling to come to Me so that you may have life."** John 5:39-40.

They were "**unwilling**." In other words, it was a matter of the heart, not the mind. And so it is even today. Pride blinds many a heart. Jeremiah said it this way: **"You will seek Me and find Me when you search for Me with all your heart."** Jer. 29:13. Do not let your emotions destroy your understanding. Do not let your feelings rule over your obedience to God. Seek God with all of your heart means to not compromise even a fraction of your heart. Facts can confuse an untrained, emotional soul. Make truth your goal. Get those "footnotes." Make God's word your guide in faith, life, family and your daily practice.
